What Employment Services are available through DDD?

DDD Employment Services and Supports also include:

Tell your Support Coordinator you want to work!

Together, you and your planning team will discuss your job goals and the services and supports you need to reach them.

DDD and Vocational Rehabilitation (VR) have services to assist you find and keep a job.



Who pays for these services?

DDD Arizona Long Term Care System (ALTCS) Program or VR pay for the services.

Work options are available to individuals who are ALTCS and Non-ALTCS eligible.

DDD Employment Services and Supports include:

Individual Supported Employment (ISE)

- Job Search services to find a competitive job in the community
- Job Coaching at a person's competitive job in the community

Employment Support Aide (ESA)

- On the job follow along supports
- Personal care assistance on the job
- Behavioral supports

Group Supported Employment (GSE)

- Community work setting
- On-site group supervision
- Learning work skills and behaviors
- Promotes community integration

Center-Based Employment (CBE)

- Provides gainful, productive and paid work experience
- Supervised work and training
- Gain support and knowledge from peers

Transition To Employment (TTE)

- Individualized training and support
- Learn work skills for integrated and competitive employment

Career Preparation And Readiness (CPR)

- Available to members receiving CBE
- Helps members make an advanced move into community employment

Transportation To Employment (TRE)

Transportation to and from work
